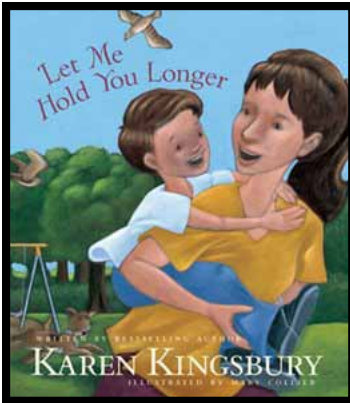

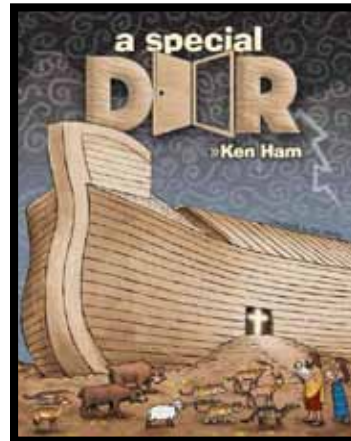
LET ME HOLD YOU LONGER

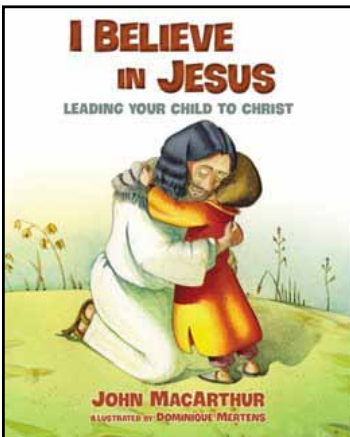
A SPECIAL DOOR

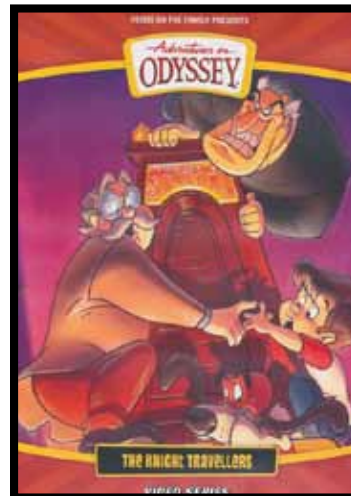


I BELIEVE IN JESUS

SIGN-OUT PROCESS

The chapel library operates on an honour system, which means that people are free to borrow materials any time, without having to go through an individual. The following are some reminders when using the chapel library:

BORROWING ITEMS:

There should be a **SIGN-OUT CARD** in an envelope for every item in the library. In books, it is normally located on the inside of the back cover. In DVDs, it is normally located inside the DVD case.

- Sign the **DATE** you took it out & **YOUR NAME**.
- Please **SIGN OUT EVERY ITEM** that you take home so that it can be tracked.
- **PLACE** the sign-out card **IN THE TOP DRAWER** of the drop-off box which is located next to the window in the library.
- Normally, we don't have a limit on the number of items taken out at one time, but it is recommended that you borrow only items that you have a reasonable expectation of using. You can borrow more items at any time.
- It is suggested that books be borrowed for a maximum of 3 weeks and DVDs for a maximum of 2 weeks. This is a guideline only but please be considerate of other people who might be interested in borrowing the materials.

RETURNING ITEMS:

When you are done with the item, just place it in the slot of the drop-off box.
