Matthew: Purpose: To clearly show the Jews that Jesus is the Promised Messiah.

Describes Jesus as King of Israel.

Emphasizes the disciples as students of their Lord.

Mark: Purpose: To exhort the Roman Christians to follow Christ at all costs.

Describes Jesus as Servant of God.

Emphasizes the disciples as followers of their Lord.

Luke: Purpose: To write an orderly account of the historical facts about Jesus.

Describes Jesus as the Son of man.

Emphasizes the cost of discipleship.

John: Purpose: To persuade his readers to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God. Describes Jesus as the Son of God.

Emphasizes the disciples as confidantes of their Lord.

Matthew's Gospel revolves around the discourses of Jesus.

There are six sections starting with narrative and ending with His teaching and instructions.
