The Throne of David

(2 Sam. 7:12-16)

- In 1 Chronicles 28:5; This throne is called the throne of the Kingdom of the LORD over Israel. In 1 Chronicles 29:23 the throne of the LORD.
- The Throne of David will be the throne of the Messiah. See also Luke 1:31-33 and Jer. 3:17
- Revelation 3:21 - The Throne of the Lord Jesus and the throne of the Father are not the same.
- Today Christ is seated with His father on the Father's throne. He will sit on His own throne in the future kingdom in Jerusalem.

The Throne of Grace

(Hebrews 4:14-16; 8:1; 10:19-25)

Hebrews uses the imagery of the Old Testament tabernacle. In this imagery the mercy-seat on top of the Ark of The Covenant is the throne of Grace where Christ is in heaven and where we can find help.



The Throne of Judgement

The Book of Revelation also uses Tabernacle imagery with the inner sanctuary, the Holy of Holies, being the place of God's throne. What is a throne of grace today for all those coming to God through the sacrifice of Christ, will become a throne of judgment during the Great Tribulation on all those dwelling on the earth. (Revelation 4:2-10; 5:1-13; 6:16; 8:3-5; 11:19; 12:5; 15:5-8; 16:17; 19:4-5)

The Great White Throne

(Revelation 20:11-15)

All the unbelievers will be brought before this throne and judged according to their sins. Their destiny will be the lake of fire.

The Judgment Seat of Christ

(2 Cor. 5:10; Rom. 14:10-12; 1 Cor. 3:10-15)

In Greek this judgment seat is called the "bema", an elevated place where the judges of athletic games sat and watched the games and gave awards to the participants.

The judgment seat is only for believers, not to deal with sin, but where the Lord Jesus will reward Christians for what they have done for Him.

The Throne of God and of the Lamb

(Revelation 22:1-5)

This throne will emanate peace in the New Jerusalem.
