1 Samuel describes Israel's failure under the family of the:

-High priest (Eli) - Wicked sons

-Judge (Samuel) - Dishonest sons

-King (Saul) - He led his sons to disaster.

The LORD then extends grace to Israel and gives David as king.

A number of major developments in Scripture linked with a young child:

- -God's Covenant with Abraham Isaac as key to God's PROMISE.
- -The Exodus from Egypt Moses as key to Israel's REDEMPTION.
- -Israel's transition to kingly rule Samuel as key to Israel's SURVIVAL.
- -Preservation of David's royal lineage Josh as key to Israel's PROTECTION.
