

What is Dispensationalism?

Dispensationalism is a system of theology that places great emphasis on the sovereignty, holiness, and glory of God. It shows Christ to be the center of God's program for the ages and the object of worship for eternity. Dispensationalism is the interpretive key that unlocks the pages of Scripture, opens the door for our understanding of prophecy, and rightly directs our thinking about God's blueprint for human history. It shows the failure of man while exalting God's mercy, grace, and faithfulness. Dispensational principles are firmly rooted in Scripture and have been used throughout every age of church history but became especially prominent in the 1800s through the writings of John Darby, C. H. Mackintosh, and William Trotter. Dispensationalism has proven itself to be a stimulus for evangelism, world missions, the study of prophecy, and the centrality of the Lord Jesus Christ.

Former President Chuck Swindoll - In an interview with *Christianity Today*, when Chuck Swindoll was asked about traditional dispensationalism at Dallas Theological Seminary, he replied, (Christianity Today, Oct. 25, 1993)

"I think that dispensations is a scare word. I'm not sure we're going to make dispensationalism a part of our marquee as we talk about our school." When asked whether the term dispensationalism would disappear, Swindoll replied, "It may and perhaps it should."

Dispensationalism Under Siege

Sensationalists, Extremists, Profiteers

Sensationalists - The present movement has been focused upon "who" the anti-Christ might be, when the Lord's coming might be, lost ark of the covenant, the red heifer, re-building the temple, and so on. Academics - To a lesser degree a dry, academic, theological debate divorced from a devotional, Christ-centered, worshipful teaching.


"The striking feature of their ministry was their simple exposition of Bible passages. They did not preach a series of sermons on different topics or hold series of evangelistic meetings, as Moody did. Rather, they held Bible study meetings. The ministry of Malachi Taylor, who died in 1897 and was succeeded for two years by A. C. Gaebelein, is a good example of how they worked. For a period of about twelve years he held a daily Bible study meeting in Temple Court in New York City. Darby himself gave a series of studies at Farwell Hall at D. L. Moody's invitation. It was this method, taken no doubt from the Brethren's example, that was expanded and used so effectively by James H. Brookes and his associates in Bible conferences all over the country."

Importance of Literal Interpretation

"Allegorical interpretation fosters modernism.
As has often been pointed out, it is almost impossible to find a premillennial liberal or modernist. Among (Plymouth) Brethren, who are supposed to be the founders of modern literalism, liberalism is practically unknown. On the other hand, the great body of modernistic Protestantism is avowed Amillennial. Thus the allegorical method of Amillennialism is a step toward modernism."

1 Thess 4:15-16

1 Thessalonians 4:16 "For the Lord himself shall descend from heaven with a shout and with the voice of the archangel and with the trump of God; and the *dead in Christ* shall rise first..."

Doctrinal Consequences

Dr. James Boice from Comm. on 1 John

"It must be acknowledged that the *church on earth will always contain* tares as well as wheat and that Christians must exercise utmost care in how they deal with them. The great temptation, particularly for those who are most serious about the church and its doctrine, is to root up the tares. But those who incline to this must remember that in Christ's parable (Matt. 13:24-30) it was precisely this course that was forbidden to the householder's servants...The time for separation was to be at the time of the final harvest when the wheat should be gathered into barns and the tares burned. The implication of Christ's parable is that some Christians are so much like non-Christians that it is impossible to tell the difference. In Christ's judgment the protection and nurture of all his followers within the church, regardless of outward appearance or degree of sanctification, are of such value that He would rather tolerate an impure church than forfeit them. (Italics mine)
