What is Dispensationalism?

Dispensationalism shows Christ to be the center of God's program for the ages and the object of worship for eternity. Dispensationalism shows the failure of man, the mercy of God, and the glory of Christ as both a Savior and King.

Dispensationalism has proven itself to be a stimulus for evangelism, and world missions, sound principles for Bible interpretation, the importance of prophecy, the centrality of Christ.

- 1. There is always spiritual and moral decline at the end of a dispensation
- 2. Salvation in every dispensation is on the basis of the blood and by faith.
- 3. Each dispensation contains responsibility, failure, judgement
- 4. Each dispensation shows Christ as the center of the ages.
- 5. Some principles over lap dispensations such as conscience, grace, promise

Word: "Dispensation"

- The word "**Dispensation**" is the translation of the Greek word *Oikonomia*, meaning "house order", "Administration", or "Stewardship."
- The word *Oikonomia* in its various forms is used over 20 times in the New Testament.
- "Age," "Ages" speaking of a specific working of God is mentioned over 30 times in the Bible. "present age" (Titus 2:12), "age to come" (Heb 2:5)

Some Observations

- **Sin** In each dispensation SIN becomes **darker**. Innocency (disobedience); Conscience (Murder) Human Government (False worship) Law (idolatry, Sexual immorality)
- **Christ** In each dispensation Christ become **brighter**. Innocency (Types of Christ) Promise, Law (Prophecy of Christ); Law (Messianic Psalms) Grace (coming of Christ); Kingdom (Kingship of Christ) Eternal state (Christ the Center)
- One Man In each dispensation God always uses one man. Innocency (Adam) Human Government (Noah) Promise (Abraham) Grace (Paul)

Dispensations - Biblical Ages

- This age, nor the age to come (Mt. 12:32)
- This present evil age (Gal. 1:4)
- The age to come (Eph. 2:7, He. 6:5)
- End of the ages (Heb. 9:26
- Ends of the ages (1 Cor. 10:11)
- Age of the ages (Eph. 3:1)

"A dispensation, then, is a period of time in which God is dealing with man in some way in which He has not dealt with Him before."

-Charles C. Ryrie

"A dispensation is a distinguishable economy in the outworking of God's purpose. If one were describing a dispensation, he would include other things such as the ideas of distinctive revelation, testing, failure, and judgement."

Dispensations & Scripture

Ephesians 1: mentions 1 Dispensation. **Ephesians 1:10**- "That in the dispensation of the fullness of times he might gather together in one all things in Christ..."

John 1 (gospel): mentions 2 Dispensations. **John 1:17** - "For the law was given by Moses but grace and truth came by Jesus Christ."

Galatians 3: mentions 3 Dispensations. (1) DISPENSATION OF PROMISE "Now to Abraham and his seed were the promises made...(v. 16) (2) DISPENSATION OF LAW "...The law, which came four hundred and thirty years after...(v. 17) (3) DISPENSATION OF GRACE "Before faith came, we were kept under the law...(v. 23) ...but after faith is come we are no longer under...(v. 25).

Three Primary Characteristics of a Biblical Dispensation

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- a. Each dispensation unfolds a unique *Rule* (*administration*) in which God conducts His affairs over men. For instance Law, Human Government, or Grace.
- b. Each dispensation unfolds a unique (new) *Revelation from God to man*. (Revelation not known in the previous dispensation.)

 Capital punishment, The Law and priesthood, tabernacle, the Church, body of Christ of which Christ is head.
- c. Each dispensation unfolds a unique **Responsibility for man** in his responsibility to God.

Three Secondary Characteristics of a Biblical Dispensation


Three Secondary Characteristics of a Biblical Dispensation

- a. Each dispensation will "apply a test" to man's obedience to God.
- b. Each dispensation will "demonstrate a failure" of man to obey God.
- c. Each dispensation will "execute divine judgment" upon man's disobedience.
