Romans Overview

- Theme: The Righteousness of God
- Written to promote **unity** in a church where there was potential for division between Jews and Gentiles
- Paul uses doctrine to persuade the Roman believers of their oneness (Romans 1:16; 3:29-30; 10:12)
- God's Righteousness is:
 - 1:18-3:20 Lacking in Unbelievers (Condemnation)
 - 3:21-5:21 Imputed to Believers (Justification)
 - 6-8 Imparted as We Walk by Faith (Sanctification)
 - 9-11 Vindicated through God's dealings with Israel
 - 12-15 Lived out in Practical Application

Romans 9-11

- 8:37-39 begs the question, "What about Israel?"
- 9:6 is the thesis statement: "God's word has not failed."
- Chapter 9 is a culmination of every point he has been building on since chapter 1 and 9:30-33 is his conclusion.
- 9:1-29 Justice of Israel's Rejection
 - Physical decent alone does not guarantee that one will inherit the promises of God
- 9:30-10:21 Reason for Israel's Rejection
 - Unbelief & Rebellion
- 11:1-10 Extent of Israel's Rejection
 - There is a remnant; not all Israel is unsaved
 - There is a future for Israel; not rejected forever
- 11:11-24 Gentiles offered Salvation through Israel's Rejection
